

Wood View News

We have had another busy season at Wood View and were delighted to receive a Certificate of Excellence once again from Trip Advisor. Following the success of last year's Grand Depart of the Tour de France, which started in Yorkshire, 2015 saw the inaugural race of the Tour de Yorkshire, which was a great success and will be run again in 2016 over 3 days, with the first stage of 185kms (116 miles) on April 29th starting in Beverley and finishing in Settle. The Dales have seen almost continuous, heavy rain since early November and the saturated ground was unable to cope with the several inches of rainfall that fell over the last weekend. The Lake District and Scottish Borders have had extensive flooding, several times, and a staggering 341.4mm (13.5 inches!) fell at Honister Pass in 24 hours – a new UK record. Fortunately, apart from a couple of leaking windows and damp corners, par for the course when living in a 300 year old house, we have escaped any damage and just have to wait for the waters to recede.
